### **Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia**

CSFP scholarship applications for the 2017-18 school can now be submitted. Priority will be given to applicants who submit by November 15<sup>th</sup>. Go to <http://www.csfphiladelphia.org/about/> for information about how to apply. Only one application per family is allowed. Scholarships are chosen by lottery. If selected, you will be notified by Children's Scholarship and then you will be expected to submit your supporting documentation. All applications must be completed online. This is a wonderful opportunity for our families and we encourage you to apply. This year, our families will receive \$92,000 in scholarships from Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia.

**Please be aware that, if you received a scholarship this year and you paid your tuition in full, you MUST call the rectory (215-745-3211) and request a refund.** It will not automatically be sent to you. In addition, the rectory requires you to fill out a Refund Request Form which can be downloaded [here](#) or from the FORMS link on the school website.

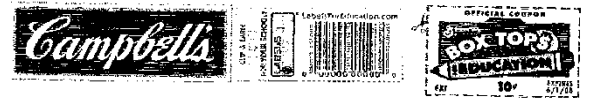

As of August 1, 2016, only UPCs with the **Labels for Education** logo on them will be accepted and redeemed for points. Campbell's has begun the process of removing this logo from all their products but expects that there will be a limited number of products that contain these labels in stores through August 1, 2017. Once all Labels for Education logos have been removed from their products, UPCs will no longer be accepted. An official date for the end of the Labels for Education program will be forthcoming. Once we hear of that date, we will let you know. Please look around your house for any Campbell's labels and send them in as soon as possible so we don't lose out if they decide to end the program soon.

## SCRIP Program

In addition to stopping by the Scrip office during operating hours, we are now set up to sell SCRIP and accept payments for SCRIP online. There are hundreds of retailers and setting up an account for your family is easy! Go to the following website, <https://www.shopwithscrip.com/getstarted/index.aspx>. In the bottom of the left hand column under "Join your existing scrip program" click on "click here". Enter the requested information and accept the terms. The next step will require entering an enrollment code for Resurrection. Our code is case sensitive and is as follows: **BFLEF1759329**.

Once you enter this code you are enrolled in Shop with Scrip and you can order anything that is available. You have two options for how you would like to pay for your SCRIP order. You can take a check to the SCRIP office in the Rectory, and your purchase will be released to you when it arrives. You can also enroll in Presto Pay. Presto Pay will allow you to pay for your scrip purchase online. The advantage of Presto Pay is that select retailers will allow you to reload existing gift cards or print gift cards from your computer. Sometimes we need something at the last minute, and being able to print at home from select retailers, who offer "Scrip Now" or gift card reloading, makes it possible to purchase on demand! Please note that approval of Presto Pay will take a few business days, so if this is something you would like to take advantage of, please take a few minutes to get the process started! Look for the Presto Pay link on the "My Account" page for Shop with Scrip.

We hope you will take advantage of this excellent opportunity. We know that many of you make great sacrifices to educate your children, and SCRIP can help ease that financial burden. This is a voluntary program, and is open to everyone who would like to take advantage of it.
